## 1.

One of the most original and creative minds in the music world today undoubtedly belongs to DICK SCHORY, who through the medium of recordings, concert tours, articles and clinics has helped bring percussion to its greatest periods of popularity. The National Academy of Recording of Arts and Sciences nominated him for the coveted "Grammy" award as "Best Arranger of $1960^{\prime \prime}$. He has numerous recordings on the "Best Seller" list. In his capacity as Ad-vertising-Educational Director for Ludwig, Dick has appeared as guest lecturer, soloist and conductor at most of the leading educational meetings throughout the country.

## 2.

Mr. A. R. CASAVANT, clinician, author and nationally known authority on precision marching conducts many workshops throughout the nation dedicated to the purpose of improving the quality of high school and college march ing units. The analysis, training and clarity of presentation of the factors in the development of a superior marching unit as taught by him have proven to be a tremendous aid to directors in producing more efficient and attractive marching bands. His many publications on precision drill include twenty-two books and a steadily increasing number of special routines with corresponding special arrangements.

LT. COL. SAMUEL KURTZ served as a Military Bandleader for over 21 years and is nationally known for his work with the Air Force Band of the West, Lackland Air Force Base, San Antonio, Texas. Lt. Col. Kurtz retired from the USAF October 31, 1964 and became associated with Southern Music Company. Prior to his military career he served as a Public School Music Supervisor in Pennyslvania for a period of 11 years. His educational background includes his B.S. in Education from State Teachers College, Bloomsburg, Penn., M. Mus. Ed., Penn. State College, D. Mus., Southern College of Fine Arts, Houston, Texas.

JOHNNY SMITH joined the NBC Staff as guitarist, arranger and conductor in 1946 in New York City. Played and conducted as many as 35 network shows a week. Some of the outstanding organizations and their conductors Johnny has performed with include - NBC Symphony, Frank Black conducting; New York Philharmonic, Dmitri Metropolis conducting and the City Center Opera with Rosenstock. His recording of "Moonlight in Vermont" won the record of the year award. He was winner of the Downbeat and Metronome Awards for three years running (19521955). He presently owns and operates Johnny Smith Music, Inc. in Colorado Springs.

## 4.

BUDDY BAKER is recognized as one of the top trombone clinicians in the nation as well as an outstanding performer. His versatility is demonstrated by his ability to work with concert or dance band with equal proficiency. Mr. Baker has toured and recorded with the Stan Kenton Band, and has taught trombone at the Stan Kenton clinics. He has also played with such great leaders as Woody Herman and Warren Covington. Buddy is presently employed at Rockley Music Co. in addition to his teaching and performing engagements.

## 6.

MAJOR VIC MOLZER, Commander and Director of the NORAD "Cavalcade of Music" was named to head this unique military musical organization in December 1964. Prior to this assignment he served as Assistant Chief and Exec. Officer of Air Force Bands at the Pentagon in Washington, D. C. for ten years, Director of the Air Force Band of the Pacific and Command Band Director, Pacific Air Forces. Major Molzer attended Nebraska Univ., the Curtiss Inst. of Music in Philadelphia, the Eastman School of Music, Univ. of Rochester, the Univ. of Maryland and received his Bachelor of Music at Catholic University. He attended the Univ. of Hawaii to receive his M.A. in Music Ed.

CAPTAIN HERMAN G. VINCENT, COmmander and Conductor of the United States Air Force Academy Band, is a veteran of 14 years with the USAF. His positions include Command Band Director, U. S. Air Forces in Europe; Continental Air Command; Air University and Command Band Director, SAC. Capt. Vincent has a M.M. from Louisiana State Univ. and has done graduate work at Juilliard Conservatory in New York City. He attended the Pierre Monteux School of Conducting, was the Assistant Bandleader and instructor in Brass at the Univ. of Wichita and played Principal trumpet with the Wichita Symphony.
