IN MEMORIAM — A TRIBUTE TO ED BARNES

I consider it an honor to write this tribute to my friend Ed Barnes. His influence in music education will long be remembered by those he taught and those of us who watched him work.

I have known Ed, "E.R.," "Big Bad Barnes" since 1976 when he first directed a number of my students at music camp in Grand Lake. Since the moment I first observed him, I knew this man was truly special. It didn't take the students too long to realize that he not only knew his stuff about jazz but that he wanted to get all of us to share in his love of jazz improvisation.

His easy-going nature provided the atmosphere to let his students be at ease so they could concentrate on being creative. His stories in rehearsal of what it was like playing on the road or other experiences he had in music always inspired his students to appreciate both the past and the present. When it came to sayings, Ed had many: "OK, let's cook."; "Barnes is my name and music is my game."; "You only get one chance to make a good first impression." and of course his famous "Ah-men!" at the end of prayers at camp meals will always echo in our memories.

Ed's ways were contagious. At the end of each summer band camp I would find myself using things I'd seen Ed use or say in class. As one of his colleagues once said about him: "There's a little Barnes in all of us."

The example he set, both as a teacher and a friend, is one I will always treasure. I hope all of us who knew him will continue to devote ourselves to music, kids, and life as he did.

Jodi is the recipient of several awards including the John Philip Sousa Award and the Dennis Thiringer Memorial Scholarship. She has lettered three years in band and one in orchestra and competed at Solo and Ensemble Festival for two years receiving outstanding ratings.

In addition to the flute, Jodi plays the saxophone and was given an award for outstanding musicianship at the 1987 Mile High Jazz festival. She was awarded Outstanding Junior and Senior Band member, she also was named Outstanding Jazz Band member

KRISTI KUSK began her musical career at age four with piano study, and in fourth grade began private instruction on the violin. In the fifth grade study of the flute was added and Kristi quickly rose to hold the position of first-chair flute in Elementary Honor Band.

Upon entering junior high school she earned first-chair in the All-City Junior High Honor Band, and later won first-chair in the Western State Honor Band. She has been first-chair flute in the High School All-Area Honor Band for three years and has played in All-State band through her high school career. She was also selected as a soloist for the Colorado Springs Concert Band and last year was the first place winner in the Rocky Mountain Flute Competition. Kristi will continue her studies next year at CU in Boulder.



JOHN SHAW



Mr. John Shaw's professional career started in 1956, upon graduation for North Texas State University, with a Bachelor of Music degree. During the next six years he taught band in the public schools of Texas and Oklahoma, and also earned a Master's Degree in Music Education from the University of Illinois.

In 1961, Mr. Shaw entered the music business in Denver, with the Simmons Music Co. Later, from 1965 to 1985, he was with Flesher-Hinton Music Co. From the beginning, he has been devoted to serving music education in Colorado, pursuing his belief that promoting music is an obligation of everyone involved, and the music education and the music business must be an active partnership.

In 1964, Mr. Shaw initiated to a small group of band directors the idea of forming the Colorado Bandmasters Association. An organizational meeting was held in January, 1965, and due to the efforts of Mr. Don A.

Smith, Akron, CO, the first CBA Convention was held the following July, with an agenda which emphasized the philosophy of promoting the total band program. Mr. Shaw has been involved in all twenty-three CBA Conventions to date, much of this time serving as the Music Industry Representative.

In 1965, recognizing the absence of Jazz Programs (then called Stage Bands) in many Colorado schools, Mr. Shaw co-founded, again with Mr. Smith, the Akron Stage Band Festival. This Festival became very popular, and grew to the point that Mr. Shaw helped organize new festivals, the most recent being the Mile High Jazz Festival.

Mr. Shaw has served school music programs over the years as an adjudicator, clinician, lecturer, and guest conductor. Most recently, he portrayed John Philip Sousa, conducting a "Sousa Spectacular" Concert with the Air Force Academy High School Band. Mr. Shaw has also been very active in educator and industry associations, both at the local and national levels. He has made presentations at CMEA and CBA, and has served on the Board of the Colorado Task Force for Music Education. In 1981, he was elected to the Board of the National Association of School Music Dealers, where he served this prestigious organization as Educational Director until his term expired in 1986.

After almost twenty-four years in the retail music business, in 1985 Mr. Shaw entered the wholesale music business. He is now Regional Representative for several companies, including the E. K. Blessing Band Instrument Co., and the Wm. Lewis and Son String Instrument Co. In addition, he and his wife Martha, who has been equally involved in the music business and in Mr. Shaw's career, own and operate a wholesale musical products business, and a uniform business, "Uniforms West."

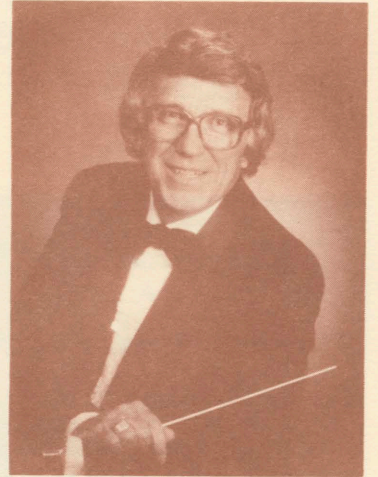

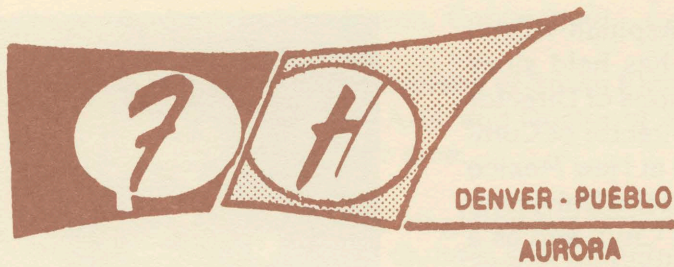

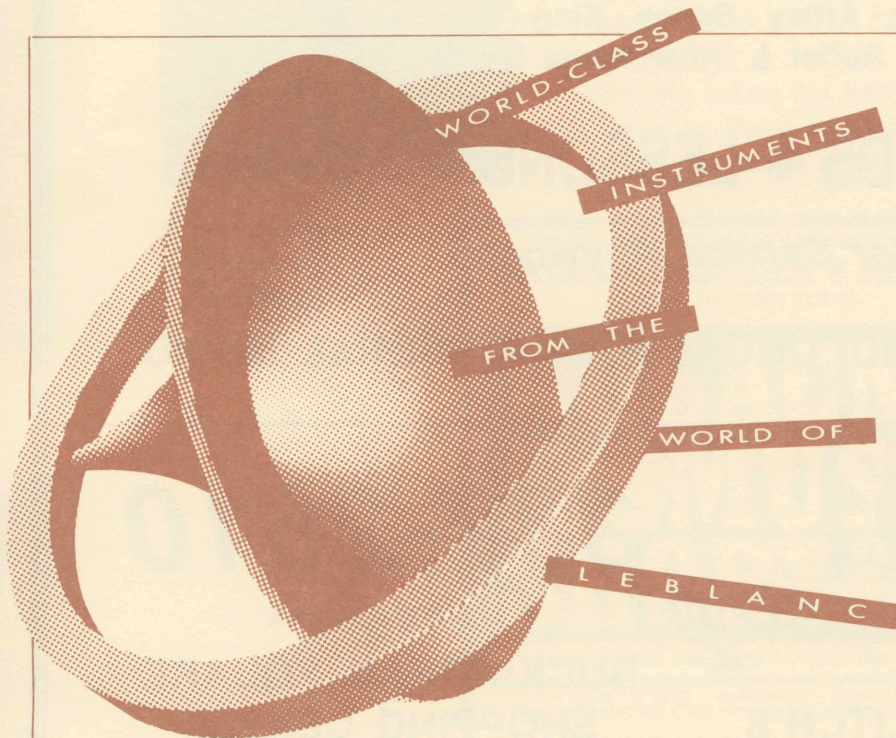

KENNETH SINGLETON

Kenneth Singleton is Director of Bands at the University of Northern Colorado in Greeley, a position he has held since June, 1985. Prior to that he was Director of Concert Bands at New Mexico State University in Las Cruces. He has also taught at the Hartt School of Music (University of Hartford), Albertus Magnus College and Yale University both in New Haven, Connecticut.

Singleton holds degrees from the University of South Florida (BA) and the Yale University School of Music (Master of Music, Master of Musical Arts, and Doctor of Musical Arts). His doctorate in tuba performance was the first awarded by Yale in that area.

Among the numerous ensembles Dr. Singleton has conducted are the Hartt Chamber Winds, Wind Ensemble, Brass Choir, Double Woodwind Quintet and Contemporary Players; the Albertus Magnus Glee Club; the Morse Chamber Wind Ensemble and Battell Chapel Choir at Yale; the New England Winds; the NMSU Wind Ensemble, Contemporary Players and Tuba Choir; the Classical Symphony (the first professional orchestra in Las Cruces); and the UNC Chamber Winds, Wind Ensemble, Symphony Band, and Summer Symphony Band.

An avid transcriber of brass music (over 1,000 titles) and a music editor for the Charles Ives Society, Singleton has some 25 publications to his credit. His new edition of Ives's THIRD SYMPHONY was recently recorded by Michael Tilson Thomas and the Concertgebow Orchestra, and has been released on Columbia Masterworks. He has also edited several dozen early works for winds. Since his arrival in Greeley, Dr. Singleton has created a number of band transcriptions, including Tchaikovsky's complete SYMPHONY NO. 2, Shostakovich's AGE OF GOLD BALLET SUITE, and Ives's POSTLUDE IN F. Current projects include wind transcriptions of Doppler's HUNGARIAN PASTORALE FANTASY, Brahms's "National Russian Hymn" from SOUVENIR OF RUSSIA, Prokofiev's IVAN THE TERRIBLE, and Stravinsky's SUITE NO. 2. He is also writing a book on the chamber wind ensemble and its music.

Singleton belongs to numerous professional organizations, including Broadcast Music Inc., the National Academy of Recording Arts and Sciences, the College Band Directors National Association, the College Music Society, the Music Educators National Conference, the Colorado Music Educators Association, and the Colorado Bandmasters Association.

Dr. Singleton is in constant demand as a guest clinician and conductor, appearing with several dozen different ensembles each year, ranging from the Denver City-Wide Band and the El Paso All-Region Concert Band, to the University of Arizona Wind Ensemble and Orchestra New England. In January, 1988, he will conduct the New Mexico All-State Band.

Singleton and his wife Elizabeth (a free lance flutist and teacher) currently live in Evans, Colorado, with their eleven cats.

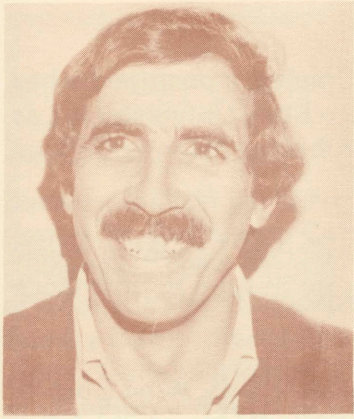

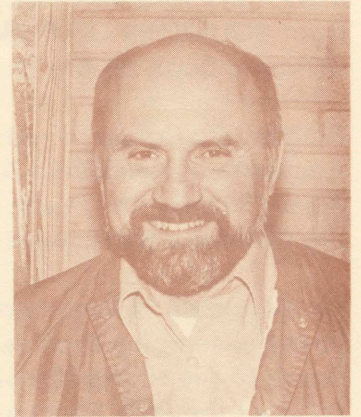
Dr. Rayder holds the MA in Industrial Psychology and a Ph.D. in Evaluation, Applied Statistics and Research Methods.

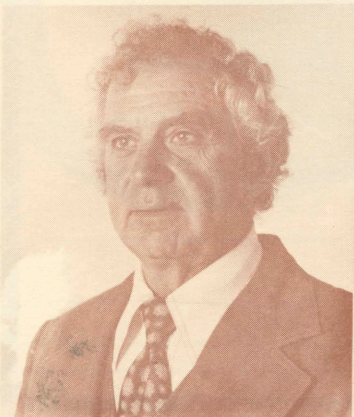
A frequent guest conductor and clinician, Dr. Cossaboom has directed festival bands and choirs throughout New England, Eastern Canada, Texas, and Colorado.

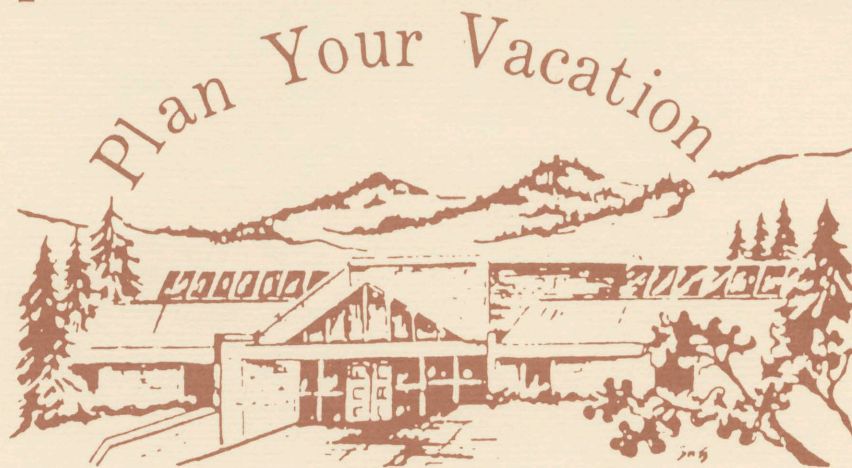


BERNARD R. "PETE" BOUCHARD
