BIOGRAPHIES OF GUEST CLINICIANS

JERRY HOOVER

Jerry Hoover graduated from Drury College and began his teaching career in Cabool, where he taught every aspect of music in this small school. He then became director of bands at Lebanon and also earned his Masters Degree from Missouri University. After earning his degree he took a position at Jefferson City Senior High and then accepted the band position at New Mexico State University in Las Cruces, New Mexico. In 1985 he returned to Missouri where he became the Director of Bands at Southwest Missouri State University. His duties consist of directing the 364 piece marching band, symphonic band, jazz band, four of the entertainment ensembles and teaching classes in marching techniques and band administration. He and his wife, Betty, will celebrate their 34th wedding anniversary in August. They have three sons, Doug, David, and Chris, and 3 grandchildren.

Over his career his high school bands have been selected to perform at the Midwest National Band Clinic in Chicago, and many other conventions in Chicago and Memphis. His marching bands have performed in the Pasadena's Rose Bowl and Nixon's Inaugural Parade in Washington D.C. At the University level, his bands have performed in Mexico City, Switzerland, Germany, Austria, England, Orange Bowl, and Macy's Thanksgiving Parade.

DAVID G. REUL

Mr. Reul has taught in Oconomowoc, Wisconsin since 1958. In addition to teaching in the middle school, he serves as coordinator of music for the district's nine schools. During his tenure in Oconomowoc he has taken the junior high (now middle school) bands to four state and three national conventions.

Mr. Reul's interests lie in the area of curriculum development. He serves on both the MENC's <u>Future Directions-Music In Middle School</u> Task Force and the committee on development of a national curriculum for band. He is active as a speaker and clinician and has served as president of the American School Band Directors Association and the Wisconsin Music Educators Association.

His awards include:

HUGO ANHALT AWARD - given to UW-M Music Alumni Association for outstanding contributions to music in the community; DISTRICT TEACHER OF THE YEAR, given by the State of Wisconsin Department of Education; CITED FOR DISTINCTION BY MENC for having developed an exemplary school band program under the heading of Teaching Musicianship Through Performance; MEDAL OF HONOR 1970, 1975, and 1980 given by the Midwest Band and Orchestra Clinic; CITATION OF EXCELLENCE given by the National Band Association; Cited by SCHOOL MUSICIAN MAGAZINE as one of ten outstanding music teachers in the United States in 1985; awarded the SUDLER CUP by John Philip Sousa Society for having achieved outstanding success as a junior high school band director on a national level; appointed to the Board of Directors of the JOHN PHILIP SOUSA SOCIETY; cited as one of TEN OF THE BEST by BANDWORLD MAGAZINE 1990.

JESS GERARDI

For 24 years Jess Gerardi has been director of the Bronco Band in Denver. He has taught in the public school system for 28 years, 2 years as a consultant and currently serves as assistant principal at Flood Junior High. Mr. Gerardi is available as an adjudicator and as a clinician.

A Colorado native, born in Trinidad, Jess Gerardi has a B.S. Degree from University of Northern Colorado at Greeley; a Master from UCLA; a PhD from University of Colorado and a Type D Degree from University of Colorado.

KENNETH SINGLETON

Mr. Singleton is Director of Bands and Chairman of Wind Conducting Program at the University of Northern Colorado in Greeley, a position he has held since June, 1985. Prior to that he was Director of Concert Bands at New Mexico State University at Las Cruces. He has also taught at the Hartt School of Music (University of Hartford), Albertus Magnus College and Yale University, both located in New Haven, Connecticut.

Kenneth Singleton holds a B.A. Degree from the University of South Florida; Master of Music, Master of Musical Arts and Doctor of Musical Arts Degrees from the Yale University School of Music. His doctorate in tuba performance was the first awarded by Yale in that area.

Mr. Singleton has conducted many varied performing groups and is an avid transcriber of brass music and music editor for the Charles Ives Society. He has some 25 publications to his credit.

Kenneth Singleton belongs to numerous professional organizations and is in constant demand as a guest clinician and conductor. This past year he received Faculty Achievement Awards from both the College of Performing and Visual Arts and from the University. He has also been named Scholar of the Year.

Kenneth and his wife, Elizabeth (a free lance flutist and teacher) presently live in Evans, Colorado with their thirteen cats.

WAYNE IIAMS

Mr. Wayne liams has been teaching school for 12 years, in that period he has had superior programs. Wayne liams graduated from the University of Northern Colorado with his B.A. degree and this summer he will receive his Masters from the University of Colorado. Wayne liams was the director of bands of Green Mountain for 10 years before accepting the position of Associate Director of Bands at UNC. During his teaching career at Green Mountain his bands received superior ratings in Large Group contest. In 1985, his jazz band performed in the International Music Festival in Florida and received the highest award presented, the Gold Medal. Then the following year his symphonic band received the Gold Medal in Washington D.C. at the International Music Festival. Since 1983, while Wayne was director at Green Mountain, his marching band was in the finals every year they participated in Class AAAA, winning State twice.

SCOTT COLEMAN

Mr. Scott Coleman became interested in physical therapy while attending high school at Central in Grand Junction, Colorado. Scott Coleman received his A.S. degree from Mesa Junior College in 1974, diploma in 1975 from the University of Utah, and his B.S. in Health Science in 1977 from the University of Colorado. Scott enjoys snow skiing, tennis, bicycling, body building (former Mr. Colorado in 1978), and former power lifter from 1972-76. Scott started working at Hilltop Rehab Hospital in 1977, then opened his private practice in 1980 which is Outpatient Orthopedic and Sports Medicine Clinic. The service his clinic provides in acute care and consultation of all sports and extra curricular activities and includes acute treatment. He is a member of the Sports Medicine Society APTA, Orthopedic Society APTA, Private Practice Society APTA, and currently a Board Member of the Colorado Chapter APTA.
