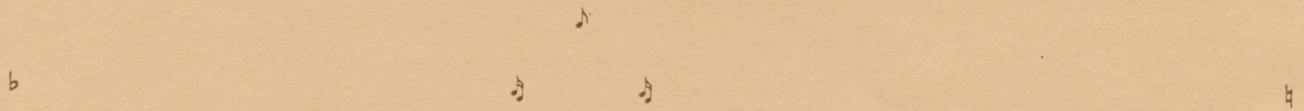

BIOGRAPHIES OF GUEST CLINICIANS

KEITH BEARDEN:

Mr. Keith Bearden is Associate Professor of Music at Texas Tech University in Lubbock. He serves as Associate Director of Bands and is director of the 400 member marching band, the "Goin Band from Raiderland". In addition, he teaches secondary techniques, conducting and performs in the Faculty Brass Quintet.

Prior to joining the staff at Texas Tech, Mr. Bearden was a public school band director in small and large schools, including Class A Jayton and Class AAAAA Lubbock Monterey. His bands were consistent first division winners in UIL and various spring music festivals in jazz, concert and marching. His marching band was invited to perform at the Cotton Bowl Classic and the Dallas Cowboys Football Club. The Monterey Jazz Ensemble was one of 8 high school organizations selected to appear on NAJE's Project II Album. In 1979, Bearden was selected as Phi Beta Mu's Outstanding Young Bandmaster of the Year for the State of Texas.

While at Texas Tech his marching band has performed for the Houston Oilers, Dallas Cowboys and Denver Broncos NFL Football Clubs, and the Tech Band has standing invitations from each of those offices for repeat performances. Mr. Bearden is active throughout the Southwest as a clinician and adjudicator. He holds memberships in the National Band Association, Texas Bandmasters Association, Texas Music Educator's Association, Texas Music Adjudicators Association, Kappa Kappa Psi, Tau Beta Sigma and Phi Mu Alpha. He currently serves as Southwest District Governor for Kappa Kappa Psi.

Willie L. HILL, JR:

Dr. Hill taught instrumental music in the Denver Public Schools at Lincoln Elementary, Hill Junior High, West High and Thomas Jefferson High Schools from 1968-1984. During this time he was an Instructional Consultant for the DPS in Music Education (1984-88) and is currently an Associate Professor in Music Education and the Assistant Dean, College of Music at the University of Colorado in Boulder.

Dr. Hill received his B.S. from Grambling State University in 1968, M.M. and Ph.D in Music Education from the University of Colorado at Boulder (1972-1987). His professional activities include being a member of the Bronco Band, a performer at the Denver Auditorium Theater, Paramount Theater, McNichols Sports Arena, Boettcher Concert Hall. He has been the featured guest soloist at a variety of nightclubs and has performed with various celebrities.

Willie is a woodwind specialist and is the founder and co-director of the Rich Matteson-Telluride Jazz Academy and was selected to represent the United States in London at the International Clarinet Symposium in 1984. Dr. Hill's credentials and accomplishments go on and on including being selected as a member of Who's Who Among International Musicians.

MIKE WILSON:

Mike received his music degrees from Indiana University of Pennsylvania and Western State College in Colorado. He has just completed his third year at Fruita Middle School and will be Director of Bands at the new Redlands Middle School in Grand Junction beginning the fall of 1992. He taught previously at West Junior High in Grand Junction and Nucla High School, bringing his teaching experience of beginning and middle school to a total of 17 years. His middle school bands have been invited to perform at CMEA Conferences 3 times in the past 8 years. He is in constant demand as a clinician and adjudicator and served as the head of the band curriculum writing team for the Grand Junction area schools. Within the greater musical community he serves as conductor of the Centennial Band (Grand Junction's Adult Community Band) and as principal clarinetist in the Grand Junction Symphony.

JOHN HANDLEY:

John is the President of Roper Music Company in Grand Junction, Colorado. He began work at Roper's in 1983 in the instrument repair department. Since that time John has not only worked through the ranks of the music store but has also served the music education of the Western Slope of Colorado. He has traveled to schools providing not only repairs and service, but has also served as a clinician in bass and jazz instruction. He has provided repair service for festivals and CBA select bands and has unselfishly been available to help out the band directors and music students whenever asked.

DR. KENNETH SINGLETON:

Dr. Singleton is Director of Bands and Chairman of Wind Conducting at the University of Northern Colorado in Greeley, a position he has held since 1985. Prior to that he was Director of Concert Bands at New Mexico State University at Las Cruces. He has also taught at the Hartt School of Music (University of Hartford), Albertus Magnus College and Yale University, both located in New Haven, Connecticut.

Ken holds a B.A. from the University of South Florida, Master of Musical Arts and Doctor of Musical Arts degrees from Yale University School of Music. His doctorate in tuba performance was the first awarded by Yale in that area. Mr. Singleton has conducted many varied performing groups and is an avid transcriber of brass music and is music editor of the Charles Ives Society. He has some 25 publications to his credit.

Kenneth Singleton belongs to numerous professional organizations and is in constant demand as a guest clinician and conductor. He has received Faculty Achievement Awards from both the College of Performing and Visual Arts and from the University of Northern Colorado. He has previously been named Scholar of the Year.

KEVIN McCARTHY:

Kevin McCarthy began his career as a high school marching, concert and jazz band director in northern Ohio. He soon added choral music to his activities and taught in colleges in both Ohio and West Virginia before achieving his Ph.D in music education and coming to the University of Colorado in 1969. He has served as a member of MENC Research Council, President of CMEA and CAAE, and as editor of the Colorado Music Educator. He is presently Associate Dean of Undergraduate Studies in Music at CU's College of Music.

CAROL BRICE:

Mrs. Brice is administrative assistant at Jones Intercable, Inc. for the corporate officer who manages the international operations of the cable company. Carol has been married to Joe Brice, Fine Arts Coordinator and Band Director at Smoky Hill High School, for 15 years. In line with Joe's position at Smoky Hill and in various offices he has held in Colorado, Carol travels with Joe and entertains at home.

In addition to her duties as wife and secretary, Carol is the mother of two, stepmother of four, mother-in-law of two and grandmother of one. Carol and Joe have invited three non-family band students to live with them over the last 15 years. Carol has helped CBA out several times in the past including the computerizing of our state constitution. Carol enjoys cooking, camping, skiing, travel and people - especially people in the band world!

KEN ANDERSON:

Ken Anderson has been married to Becky, an orchestra teacher in Thornton, Colorado for 16 years. He received a B.A. in Music Education from Western State College in Gunnison and taught in Pine Bluffs, Wyoming. He became principal euphonium in the Continental Army Command Band in Virginia when Uncle Sam interrupted his teaching career. Ken joined Flesher-Hinton as a road salesman, and for the past 15 years has managed the sheet music department. He is a member of MENC, RSMDA, IAJE, Kappa Kappa Psi, the Colorado Bandmasters Association, and is manager and charter member of the Rocky Mountain Brassworks British Brass Band. Ken has been a tremendous help to CBA for over 10 years, assisting with the State Marching Festivals, Convention Exhibits, Trophies and numerous other committees and services.

GARY MURPHY:

Gary Murphy has been the Principal at Highlands Ranch High School since 1986 following terms as principal for Parker Junior High and Larkspur Elementary. Gary graduated from Pennsylvania State University, with a B.S. in Secondary Education with a major in Mathematics in 1971. He then taught math in Central Bucks School District in Doylestown, Pennsylvania and Douglas County School District in Castle Rock, Colorado until 1978. In 1979 Gary received his M.A. in Administration and Supervision from the University of Colorado, Boulder. Mr. Murphy has served on several panels throughout the state addressing the current trends in today's education.
