# 1998 CBA Summer Convention

**Douglas Akey** began his musical training in the public schools of Elmhurst, Illinois. He attended Arizona State University on a performance scholarship, earning a Bachelor of Music degree in Instrumental Music (1979) and a Master of Music in Solo Performance (1985). He also studied brass performance for two summers at the Banff Centre for the Performing Arts in Alberta, Canada. He has studied horn with Carroll Simmons -- Grand Park Orchestra (Chicago), William Strickland -- free-lance hornist (New York), Ralph Lockwood -- Arizona State University, and Roland Pandolfi -- Principal Horn, Saint Louis Symphony.

Mr. Akey will begin his twelfth year as Director of Bands and Music/Drama Department Chairperson at Hendrix Junior High School in Chandler, Arizona. He has taught junior high school band for nineteen years in the Phoenix area. His bands have been invited to perform at numerous Music Educator Conferences, including the 1994 Midwest International Band and Orchestra Clinic and the 1998 Music Educators National Conference. He is in demand as a clinician having directed many junior high and high school honor bands throughout the West. He has also presented sessions at music conventions in Arizona, Colorado, Ohio, and Wyoming.

In 1985, Mr. Akey received the Stanbury Award of the American School Band Directors Association as the outstanding young junior high school band director in the United States. Since that time, he has gone on to become recognized as an accomplished composer of school band music. His works have appeared on dozens of state contest lists and are performed by bands throughout North America, Europe, Australia, and the Far East. He has also served on occasion as a Contributing Editor to *Bandworld* magazine with articles on junior high band literature and teaching techniques. In 1996, he was honored as the National Federation of Secondary Schools Music Educator of the Year for Section 7 (Arizona, California, Hawaii, Nevada, and Utah).

Mr. Akey is an active performer, having played with the Del Sol Brass Quintet and Arizona Brass Quintet as well as the Phoenix and Tucson Symphony Orchestras. He currently serves as principal horn with the Tempe Symphony Orchestra.

**Dr. Ritchie Clendenin** earned his Master of Music degree from Yale University in 1967, and immediately won national prominence as trumpet soloist at the White House wedding of Linda Bird Johnson and Captain Charles Robb. For the next four years, he was soloist with the United States Marine Band, after which he returned to the University of Colorado for his Doctor of Musical Arts degree. Since 1973 he has been a professor of music at California State University, Fresno. In 1988, Dr. Clendenin organized the British Brass Band at California State University, Fresno. The band performed at the 1996 International Brassfest and hosted a Yamaha British Brass Band Workshop in 1991. English mentors of the band are Philip Wilby (University of Leeds) and Geoffrey Brand (City of London Wind Ensemble). American brass mentors include Frank Baird (University of Colorado), Robert Nagel (Yale University), and John Kincaid (Western State College).
