DR. PETER LOEL BOONSHAFT

Peter Loel Boonshaft holds Bachelor of Music (Summa Cum Laude), Master of Music Education in Conducting, and Doctor of Musical Arts degrees. Dr. Boonshaft was also awarded a Connecticut General Fellowship for study at the Kodaly Musical Training Institute, from which he holds a Specialist Certificate. He is currently on the faculty of Holfstra University in Hempstead, New York, where he is Professor of Music and Director of Bands. He is Conductor of the Hofstra University Wind Ensemble and Symphonic Band, professor of conducting and music education, and Director of the graduate wind conducting program. In addition, he has served as a Senator for the Humanities on the University Senate and the Executive Board of the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences. Prior to this appointment, Dr. Boonshaft was on the faculty of Moravian College in Bethlehem, Pennsylvania, where he was Director of Bands, and Founder and Music Director of the Pennsylvania Youth Honors Concert Band. He was formerly on the faculty of the University of Hartford, where he was Founder and Music Director of the Connecticut Valley Youth Wind Ensemble, the high school honors band comprised of the finest musicians from throughout the entire State of Connecticut. In addition, he served as Director of the University's Summer Youth Music Program.

He was an Advisory Board member and Adjudicator for the Fiesta International Music Festivals in Mexico as well as Encore International, and is currently an adjudicator for Festivals of Music. In addition, he held the post of Music Director and Conductor of the Metropolitan Wind Symphony of Boston. Active as a proponent of new literature for concert band, he has commissioned and conducted over twenty-nine world premieres by such notable composers as W. Francis McBeth, Johan de Meij, Fisher Tull, H. Owen Reed, Vaclav Nelhybel, David Gillingham, Andrew Boysen, Robert W. Smith, David Holsinger, Robert Washburn, Elliot Del Borgo, Herbert Deutsch, Robert Hawkins, Larry Lipkis, Ian McDougall, Reber Clark, Gregory Sanders, Roland Barrett and Jera Spears. Dr. Boonshaft is also the author of *Vaclav Nelhybel: His Life and Works*, the only authorized biography of the composer, and articles for Instrumentalist Magazine, the National Band Association Journal, MENC's Teaching Music and Band Director's Guide. In addition, he holds the post of Band/Wind Ensemble Editor for the School Music News. Among the soloists who have appeared in performance with Dr. Boonshaft are John Marcellus, Harvey Phillips, Ed Shaughnessy, Lynn Klock, Don Butterfield, Gregory Zeitlin, Dave Steinmeyer and the United States Air Force "Airmen of Note", Maynard Gerguson, Chester Schmitz, and the Vienna Schubert Trio.

Dr. Boonshaft has been awarded membership in Pi Kappa Lambda and Alpha Chi, as well as twice receiving the University of Hartford Regent's Award. He was also given that University's Outstanding Music Educator Award. He has received official proclamations from the Governor of four states and a Certificate of Appreciation from President Ronald Reagan, as well as performing for President and Mrs. George Bush, and for Margaret Thatcher, Former Prime Minister of the United Kingdom. His honors also include being selected three times as a National Endowment of the Arts "Artist in Residence", a Commendation from the Music Educators National Conference, and being selected for the Center for Scholarly Research and Academic Excellence at Hofstra University. Extremely active as a guest conductor and clinician for festivals, concerts, and workshops across the country and throughout Mexico, Canada, and the Caribbean, he was chosen to conduct the All-Eastern Band for the 1997 MENC Eastern Division Conference in Baltimore, Maryland, as a featured clinician at the 1997 National Convention of the Canadian Music Educators Association, and as conductor of the All-Eastern Directors Band for the 1999 MENC Eastern Division Conference in New York City, and as clinician for the 1999 European Music Educators Convention in Heidelberg, Germany.

DR. ED HUCKEBY

Dr. Ed Huckeby is currently an Associate Vice President for Academic Affairs at Northeastern State University (Oklahoma), serving as chief administrative officer for the Tulsa and Broken Arrow campuses. Prior to this appointment, he was an arts administrator for Tulsa Ballet Theaters, Inc., directing the general operations of Oklahoma's premiere international ballet company. He also holds the title of emeritus professor of music at Northwestern Oklahoma State University where he served as music department chairman and dean of the graduate school for 22 years.

Prior to his appointment at Northwestern in 1976, he spent eight years teaching instrumental music in the public schools of Oklahoma where his marching, concert and jazz bands won state and regional acclaim. His success in the public schools of Oklahoma led him into the college teaching ranks where he became internationally recognized as an outstanding music educator and composer of almost 100 published works for concert and marching band. Ed's ability to write interesting and accessible instrumental music can be attributed to his experience at a variety of musical levels. Huckelby's performance background and experience is also very eclectic, having been a member of a symphony orchestra (horn), a jazz band (trumpet), and a contemporary Christian quintet (bass guitar and vocals), as well as having served regularly as a church organist and pianist. His outstanding contributions to the concert and marching band literature have played an important role in the development of the contemporary band repertoire.

Ed holds a bachelor's degree in music education from East Central University in Ada, Oklahoma, a master's degree in music education from the University of Oklahoma, and a doctorate in administration from Oklahoma State University with additional study at the University of North Texas. He has written music education articles for **The Instrumental, The American Music Teacher, and the Journal of the International Horn Society,** and has held memberships in Music Educators National Conference, Oklahoma Music Educators Association, Oklahoma Bandmasters Association, A.S.C.A.P., Phi Mu Alpha Sinfonia, and Phi Beta Mu, where he has served as a member of the national board of directors and state chapter president. Huckeby was selected as an "Outstanding Young Man in America", is listed in the "International Who's Who in Music", and was inducted into the Oklahoma Bandmasters Association "Hall of Fame" in 1996. He has created over 25 commissioned works and regularly serves as a clinician, adjudicator and conductor for instrumental music ensembles around the world.

WAYNE MARKWORTH

Wayne has been Director of Bands at Centerville High School in Ohio for the past 30 years. He also served as Fine Arts Coordinator for the Centerville City Schools for five years and is presently High School Music Department Chair as well as Band Director.

The Centerville Band program involves over 250 students including three concert bands, three jazz ensembles, marching band, and Winter Guard and Percussion. They have received consistent superior ratings and awards. The Symphonic Band, Jazz Ensembles, and Marching Band have performed at OMEA state conventions. The marching band, known as "The Centerville Jazz Band", is a unique and entertaining ensemble of 200 members that performs an all-jazz format on the field. They have been finalists in Bands of America Regionals and Grand Nationals 53 times, with six regional championships and the 1992 Grand Nationals Championship.

Wayne has been a consultant, arranger, and instructor for many bands and drum corps. His articles have appeared in several national music publications. He also performed for four years as principal trumpet with the Dayton Philharmonic Orchestra and studied trumpet with Vincent Cichowicz of the Chicago Symphony. Wayne received a Bachelor of Music Education degree from Indiana University and a Master of Music degree from Northwestern University. In 1992, he received an Excellence in Teaching Award from the Dayton-Montgomery County Public Education Foundation and in 2000 received the Centerville Education Foundation Teacher of the Year Award. Wayne currently writes for Rocky Mountain Arrangements and Music Expresso and is an active clinician, adjudicator, arranger and trumpet performer.
