Elliot Del Borgo

Born in Port Chester, NY, Elliot Del Borgo holds a B.S. degree from the State University of New York, an Ed.M. degree from Temple University, and an M.M. degree from the Philadelphia Conservatory of Music, where he studied theory and composition with Vincent Persichetti and trumpet with Gilbert Johnson. In 1973 he was granted the doctoral equivalency by the State University of New York and was elected to membership in the American Bandmasters Association in 1993.

Mr. Del Borgo taught instrumental music in the Philadelphia public schools and was professor of music at the Crane School of Music, where he held teaching and administrative posts from 1966 to 1995. An award-winning member of ASCAP, he is a frequent consultant, clinician, lecturer, and adjudicator in the United States and abroad. Mr. Del Borgo is an internationally known conductor of bands and orchestras.

In addition to his music for the 1980 Olympics in Lake Placid, he has published nearly 500 compositions for a variety of media. His music reflects the aesthetics of twentieth-century musical ideals through its eclectic nature and vigorous harmonic and rhythmic style.

Blair Bielawski (Peter Blair)

Blair Bielawski (Peter Blair) is the Creative Director for *Heritage JazzWorks*, a division of The Lorenz Corporation. An accomplished composer and arranger, Blair has over sixty compositions and arrangements in print, as well as many commissions for college, high school and middle school groups throughout the United States. Most recently, he was recognized by ASCAP (American Society of Composers and Publishers) for his compositions for young jazz ensemble. Before joining Lorenz, he was a member of the Hal Leonard editorial, arranging, and sales staff for 17 years, working on all aspects of the instrumental catalog.

Blair earned a B.A. in Music Education in 1981, and completed a Masters degree in saxophone performance at the University of Wisconsin in 1984. During his tenure as band director at Arrowhead High School (Hartland, WI), he developed both concert band and jazz ensemble programs. His groups were awarded outstanding ensemble honors at national competitions in Hollywood and Chicago. Blair also served as jazz ensemble director at Carroll College, having groups highlighted at college festivals in 1990 and 1991. He has appeared as a clinician at jazz festivals with Bob Mintzer, Frank Mantooth, and Doug Beach.

He has worked with many major print music retailers as a resource person and as an advocate for music education. He has served on the Board of Directors for the Wisconsin Music Education Association and the Retail Print Music Dealers Association.

Jeffrey M. Moore

Jeffrey Moore received his Bachelor's of Music Education Degree from the University of North Texas and his Master's Degree in Percussion Performance from the University of Wisconsin - Madison. Active in all facets of percussion, he has performed with several major symphony orchestras and is a frequent performer of chamber music. He also performs on drum set, and is an international clinician, lecturer, and soloist.

Professor Moore's duties at UCF include conducting the large "Pop" Percussion Ensemble, the Chamber Percussion Ensemble, the Marimba Band and the UCF Steel Drum Band. Additionally, he supervises the instruction and music arranging for the Marching Knights drumline. Professor Moore teaches all applied percussion majors and minors, as well as a percussion techniques class for music education majors.

Professor Moore has served as the Percussion Director of the internationally acclaimed Madison Scouts Drum and Bugle Corps, and as Program Consultant/Percussion Arranger with several European, Japanese, and Indonesian drum corps and bands. He was the battery arranger for the 1999 DCA World Champion Syracuse Brigadiers.

Professor Moore is an associate editor of *Percussive Notes*, and serves on the Education Advisory Committee for Latin Percussion International and Pro-Mark Incorporated. He is the Education Director of the Paiste Corporation based in Lucerne, Switzerland, and is also a member of the College Pedagogy Committee and Marching Percussion Committee within the Percussive Arts Society International.

Professor Moore is a Yahama Performing Artist/Clinician, and endorses Paiste cymbal, sounds, and gongs. He endorses Pro-Mark sticks and mallets, and has a signature model marching stick. Professor Moore also endorses Remo Drum Heads, Latin Percussion, and Real Feel Drum Pads.

Ed Caner

Ed Caner holds a master's degree in violin performance from Cleveland State University, a master's degree in Physics Entrepreneurship from Case Western Reserve University, and undergraduate degrees with honors in physics and engineering from Miami University. Labeled by the Cleveland Plain Dealer as "One of the most versatile musicians on the planet," he has performed as soloist or back-up musician for over 50 major artists, including Wayne Newton, Smokey Robinson, Page and Plant, Luciano Pavarotti, and the bands Runaway Truck Ramp and Leftover Salmon. Ed's teaching credits include rock violin clinician with the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame, bluegrass instructor at the Rocky Grass Academy in Lyons, Colorado, bluegrass performer/lecturer at the Trinity Chamber Series in Cleveland, and clinician at the Western Slopes Summer Music Festival in Crested Butte, Colorado. Ed wrote the book, "Fiddling for Classical Stiffs" (available on Latham Music), during his tenure as the fiddling instructor at H.B. Woodsongs in Boulder, Colorado. He has published articles in the New York Times, The Cleveland Plain Dealer, and The Ohio Music Educator's Association Triad, and has appeared on CNN for his work in the Physics Entrepreneurship Program at Case Western Reserve University. Ed lives in Cleveland, Ohio, where he frequently gives clinics on alternative styles for strings in the surrounding school districts.

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Dr. Kathleen Horvath

Dr. Kathleen A. Horvath, Assistant Professor of String Education and Pedagogy, joined the Case Western Reserve University faculty in 2001. Her duties include teaching undergraduate and graduate level courses in music education, string pedagogy, and directing the University Circle Chamber Orchestra. She holds a Bachelor of Music from the Eastman School of Music (Double Bass), a Master of Arts in Performance and String Pedagogy and Doctor of Philosophy in Music Education from The Ohio State University. Her research is primarily focused on the prevention of performance related injuries through correct positioning of the body and the accompanying teaching methodology that facilitates accurate development. Dr. Horvath taught public school strings in New York, Massachusetts, Ohio, and Georgia. She has served on the faculties of the University of Illinois and The Eastman School of Music.

Bob Berheide

Bob Berheide is currently a District Manager for the Selmer Company. Prior to joining Selmer, he was a teacher in Indiana for 13 years. Bob's teaching carrier included Percussion Specialist for the Anderson, Indiana Community Schools, Assistant Band Director at Eastside Middle School in Anderson, Indiana, Percussion Specialist for Concord Schools in Elkhart, Indiana and Adjunct Faculty for Taylor University in Upland, Indiana. As an Adjudicator, Bob is a member of the Central States Judges Association certified in Music Execution, Music GE and Percussion. Bob has judged several circuit championships in Wisconsin, Michigan, Illinois and Ohio. He was on the CSJA Board of Directors from 1993 to 1995. As a performer, Bob was a Section Percussionist with the South Bend Symphony and was Principal Percussionist with several community orchestras in central Indiana. Currently Bob lives in Olathe, KS and travels a five state territory for Selmer.

J. Steven Moore

J. Steven Moore is Director of Bands at Colorado State University where he conducts the wind ensemble, directs the marching band, and teaches conducting. He also directs the Rocky Mountain Summer Music Camp. Dr. Moore has a B.M.E. from the University of South Carolina and M.M. and D.M.A. in instrumental conducting from the University of Kentucky. He has 10 years experience as the band director at Lafayette High School and Jessie Clark Middle School in Lexington, Kentucky and 4 years as the Assistant Director of Bands at the University of Kentucky. Additionally he has served as the Director of Orchestras at UK and as the Conductor for the Central Kentucky Youth Orchestras. Under his direction, the Lafayette Band received many awards including an appearance at the Midwest Band and Orchestra Clinic, the Sudler Shield, the Macy's Parade, as well as 6 State Marching Band Championships. The Department of Education in 1993 selected him as the Kentucky High School Teacher of the Year. His wife, Tara, is a music teacher at Beattie Elementary in Fort Collins.
