Jay Bocook

Jay Bocook , Director of Athletic Bands, is a native of Clearwater, Florida, a Furman graduate and is recognized internationally as a composer, arranger, conductor and educator. Bocook's work has been heard during the 1984 Olympic Games in Los Angeles, the 1996 Centennial Olympic Games in Atlanta and the 2002 Winter Olympic Games in Salt Lake City, Utah. In the summer of 2003, his music transcriptions of noted film composer John Williams were premiered by the U.S. Marine Band in a concert at the Kennedy Center in Washington, D.C. and conducted by the composer. In addition, Mr. Bocook was a contributing arranger to a new musical *CyberJam* that opened in London to rave reviews in the fall of 2003 at the Queens Theater.

In 1982 Bocook was appointed director of bands at Furman University where remained until 1989. He has served as Assistant Conductor of the Greenville Symphony Orchestra and remains a principal composer and arranger for Hal Leonard Corporation. He has been the arranger for the current and eight-time World Champion Cadets of Bergen County Drum and Bugle Corps . As for his involvement with the Furman Marching Band, Bocook hopes to continue the strong tradition of music making that is synonymous with Furman while empowering the students to create their own legacy. He envisions an organization on the "cutting edge" of the marching world; one that is a quality experience, both musically and visually, for the Furman community. Jay Bocook is the faculty advisor for Phi Mu Alpha Sinfonia .

J. Steven Moore

J. Steven Moore is Director of Bands at Colorado State University where he conducts the wind ensemble, directs the marching band, and teaches conducting. He also directs the Rocky Mountain Summer Music Camp. Dr. Moore has a B.M.E. from the University of South Carolina and M.M. and D.M.A. in instrumental conducting from the University of Kentucky. He has 10 years experience as the band director at Lafayette High School and Jessie Clark Middle School in Lexington, Kentucky and 4 years as the Assistant Director of Bands at the University of Kentucky. Additionally he has served as the Director of Orchestras at UK and as the Conductor for the Central Kentucky Youth Orchestras. Under his direction, the Lafayette Band received many awards including an appearance at the Midwest Band and Orchestra Clinic, the Sudler Shield, the Macy's Parade, as well as 6 State Marching Band Championships. The Department of Education in 1993 selected him as the Kentucky High School Teacher of the Year. His wife, Tara, is a music teacher at Beattie Elementary in Fort Collins.

Matt Turner

Matt Turner graduated from the Lawrence University Conservatory of Music in 1989, and went on to receive his Master of Music degree in Third Stream Studies at the New England Conservatory of Music, where he was the recipient of a Distinction in Performance Award. He is widely regarded as one of the world's leading improvising cellists. Strings magazine says that "Turner dazzles with his own improvisational excursions and displays his expansive cello vocabulary." JazzIz magazine describes his cello playing as "rich-toned and inventive." Also a highly accomplished pianist, Mr. Turner performs everything from jazz standards and twentieth century new music to alternative rock and improvised avant-garde. Turner has performed or recorded with Marilyn Crispell, Joseph Jarman, John Butcher, Gerry Hemingway, Myra Melford, Francois Houle, Scott Fields, and Jeff Song. In addition, his performances are featured on 40 recordings released by Meniscus, Stellar, O.O. Discs, Asian Improv, Rastascan, Geode, Cadence, Music and Arts, Accurate, Penumbra, Tautology, and other labels. Turner continues to be active as a teacher and clinician as well, presenting numerous improvisation clinics and residencies to college and pre-college string students, and also to string teachers, each year. Matt Turner is a Yamaha performing artist. Turner serves on the Lawrence University Conservatory of Music faculty as a lecturer in jazz.

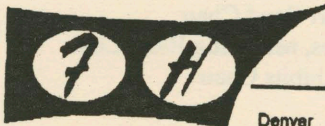
