#### **Ray E. Cramer**

Ray E. Cramer holds a BA in Education from Western Illinois University; an MFA from the University of Iowa; Honorary Doctorates from Western Illinois University and VanderCook College of Music; in 2009 was awarded an Honorary Professorship at the Musashino Academia of Musicae in Tokyo. Prior to his appointment at Indiana University Mr. Cramer taught public school in Bardolph, Illinois (1961-62) West Liberty, Iowa (1963-65) Harlan, Iowa (1965-68) and Parma, Ohio 1968-69)


Ray E. Cramer was a member of the Indiana University School of Music faculty from the fall of 1969 through May 2005. In 1982, Mr. Cramer was appointed Director of Bands. Under his leadership the Indiana University Wind Ensemble earned an international reputation for outstanding musical performances including the 1982 American Bandmasters Association Convention, Indianapolis; the 1984 joint American Bandmasters Association/Japan Bandmasters Association Convention, Tokyo;

the 1988 MENC National Convention, Indianapolis; the 1991 National CBDNA Convention in Kansas City, the 1994 National MENC Convention in Cincinnati, the 1995 American Bandmasters Association Convention in Lawrence, Kansas; the 1997 National CBDNA Convention in Athens, Georgia; a 2000 CBDNA regional performance and a spring tour to Japan, performing in six cities and the Japan Band Clinic; The 2003 CBDNA National Convention in Minneapolis, MN; a December 2003 performance at The Midwest Clinic; plus numerous other regional and state conventions.

In addition to his administrative responsibilities as the Department of Bands/Wind Conducting Chair, Mr. Cramer taught graduate courses in wind conducting, history and literature. He also conducted the University Orchestra for seven years during the fall semester. (1994-2001) Mr. Cramer enjoyed a 36-year tenure at Indiana University with the final 24 years as Director of Bands.

He is a past National President of the College Band Directors National Association. The American Bandmasters Association and has served as president of the Indiana Bandmasters Association, the North Central Division of CBDNA and the Big Ten Band Directors Association. He has just finished a 13-year tenure as the President of the Midwest Clinic, an international band and orchestra convention held in Chicago each December with approximately 17,000 attendees from every state and nearly 40 foreign countries.

In the fall of 2010 Mr. Cramer will



return to the Musashino Academy of Music to celebrate his 20-year association with this outstanding music conservatory.

Some of the favorite non-music activities that Ray and Molly enjoy involve almost everything outdoors. He and his wife have climbed over twenty 14,000-foot mountain peaks in Colorado where they also enjoy backpacking and hiking various Colorado trails. Fly fishing, snow skiing, biking and golfing are other favorite pastimes.

He and his wife Molly reside in Colorado Springs to be close to their children, and grandchildren and they are a lot closer to the mountains they love.

Scott D. Laird, a native of Indiana, PA, earned his B.S. in Music Education and his M.A. in Violin Performance from Indiana University of Pennsylvania. He is an Instructor of Music and Fine Arts Coordinator at the North Carolina School of Science and Mathematics where he directs the orchestra and teaches courses in Recording Technology, Classical Guitar and Piano, and Music History. He is an active string educator. performer, recording artist, and conductor. His orchestras have been recognized at the local. regional, and national level for their superior and musically mature performances.

Prior to his appointment to NCSSM in 2001, Laird was director of orchestras for Eleanor Roosevelt High School in Greenbelt, MD from 1992-2001 and the district-wide string teacher for the Palmyra, PA school district from 1986-1992. While in Palmyra, he founded the Palmyra

Bluegrass String Camp, a camp to teach string players with classical backgrounds the fundamentals of bluegrass music. He is a member of Music Educators National Conference, American String Teachers Association, and served as Chair of the North Carolina Music Educators' Association Orchestra Division from 2006-2008. Additionally, he is President-Elect of the NC Chapter of The American String Teachers' Association.

Laird is nationally visible as a Education Specialist for D'Addario Strings, NS Design Violins, and Coda Bows where he is a noted as an authority on string education, electric and MIDI string instruments and their applications in the classroom. He has conducted many high school and middle school orchestra festivals throughout the United States and is in demand as a quest conductor of honors youth orchestras. He is also an active adjudicator having served as a judge for a variety of orchestra and solo and ensemble festivals throughout the United States as well. He has studied conducting with Mr. William Hudson of the Fairfax, VA Symphony and the University of Maryland. Laird is the recipient of the 2010 NC School of Science and Math Award for Exceptional Contribution in Classroom Innovation. It was awarded based on curriculum development with emphasis on innovation and technology, innovative teaching strategies. and innovative teaching activities. In addition, Laird serves on

the Board of Directors of KidzNotes, a not-for-profit organization that promotes classical, orchestral music training for children in Durham's poorest neighborhoods.


In addition, Laird is an active electric violinist and recording artist and has appeared on the Motown, REX and Roadrunner record labels. His latest solo CD entitled, "Simple Gifts," features his writing and performing on a variety of string instruments with an emphasis on the electric violin. He is also well known for his electric violin work with the thrash metal band. Believer. The Gospel Music Association nominated their last album, Dimensions, for a Dove Award in 1993. Recently, Scott collaborated with Motown artist and former student, Mya, writing and performing the orchestration on the song "Nothing at All." In his spare time, Laird enjoys a variety of activities including running and camping, as well as road and mountain bik-He, his wife, Barbra, and ing. their sons, Matthew, Joseph, and Cael, reside in Durham, NC.



#### Samuel R. Hazo

Samuel R. Hazo resides in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania with his wife and children. In 2003, Mr. Hazo became the first composer in history to be awarded the winner of both composition contests sponsored by the National Band Association. He has composed for the professional, university and public school levels in addition to writing original scores for television, radio and the stage. His original symphonic compositions include performances with actors Brooke Shields, James Earl Jones, David Conrad and Richard Kiley. He has also written symphonic arrangements for three-time Grammy Award winning singer/songwriter Lucinda Williams. Mr. Hazo's compositions have been performed and recorded world-wide, including performances by the Tokyo Kosei Wind Orchestra (national tour), the Birmingham Symphonic Winds (UK) and the Klavier Wind Project's recordings with Eugene Migliaro Corporon. Additionally, his music is included in the series "Teaching Music Through Performance in Band." Mr. Hazo's works have been premiered and performed at the Music Educators' National Conference, Midwest Band and Orchestra Clinic, World Association for Symphonic Bands and Ensembles Convention, National Honor Band of America, National Band Association/TBA Convention, College Band Directors' National Association Convention and also aired in fulllength programs on National Public Radio. He has served as composer-in-residence at Craig Kirchhoff's University of Minnesota Conducting Symposium and has also lectured on music and music education at universities and high schools internationally. In 2004, Mr. Hazo's compositions were listed in a published national survey of the "Top Twenty Compositions of All Time" for wind band.

Mr. Hazo has been a music teacher at every educational grade level from kindergarten through college, including tenure as a high school and university director. Mr. Hazo was twice named "Teacher of Distinction" by the southwestern Pennsylvania Teachers' Excellence Foundation. He received his bachelor's and master's degrees from Duquesne University where he served on the Board of Governors and was awarded as Duquesne's Outstanding Graduate in Music Education. Mr. Hazo serves as a guest conductor and is a clinician for Hal Leonard Corporation. He is also sponsored by Sibelius Music Software. Recordings of his compositions appear on Klavier Records and Mark Records.




